ROTATION TITLE: Inpatient Psychiatry Clerkship Center for Drug and Alcohol Programs (CDAP)
4North

SITE DESCRIPTION:

This clerkship focuses primarily on pharmacy practice in the area of adult inpatient management of substance use disorders. Comorbid psychiatric disorders are commonly seen in this population and include affective disorders, anxiety disorders, and schizophrenic disorders. The resident is closely involved as a full member of a treatment team and participates in a number of activities in the CDAP Inpatient treatment program.

ROTATION RESPONSIBILITIES:

- **Provide primary care services under MD/Pharm.D. supervision to assigned patients at an acceptable level of care to include:**

Daily morning interview and assessment of assigned patients
Presentation of patient and progress at morning rounds
Daily afternoon interview and assessment of assigned patients
Order appropriate medications and laboratory tests
Follow up on laboratory tests
Daily review of patients' progress with nursing staff and other health professional as needed.
Ward rounds and provision of drug information.

- **Medication monitoring:**

Attend patient groups and activities as indicated.
Attend one (4) AA/NA meetings with or without patients the first week of the clerkship week.

- **Education group leader**

Attend Psychopharmacology Education Group Attendance
Conduct one (1) education group

- **Meet with Pharm.D. students on a regular basis and provided educational assignments as assigned.**

ACTIVITIES:

Expected hours

- 7:00AM to 4:00 PM; As patient care requires, the above listed times may vary.

Required meetings

- Four (4) AA/NA Meetings the first week
- Daily preceptor meeting
- Pharm.D. student meeting once weekly

- Psychopharmacology Education Group once weekly
- Psychiatry Grand rounds once weekly
- Pharmacy Grand Rounds once weekly

Required presentations

- Psychopharmacology Education Group once
- One presentation to Team
- One presentation to Preceptor

METHOD OF EVALUATION:

Evaluation of residents will be based on the Resident Learning System. The RPD will identify the specific goals and objectives on which the resident will be evaluated during the CDAP clerkship and will give the evaluation form to the preceptor and resident by the first day of the rotation. The individualized evaluation tool will be reviewed by the resident and preceptor to guide the learning experiences of the resident within the scope of the service and required patient care.
