Note. In randomized clinical trials, each of the sites designed, implemented, and evaluated one or more “supported employment (SE)” programs to aid persons with severe mental illness and work disabilities to re-enter competitive employments. Sites were Baltimore; Hartford; Philadelphia; Phoenix; Portland, Maine; San Antonio; Sumter, South Carolina; and Worcester, Massachusetts. The Collaborative’s Coordinating Center’s Principal (PI) and Co-Principal Investigators (Co-PI), and the sites’ PI and some Co-PIs authored these papers.
