RESEARCH EXPERIENCE:

Co-Investigator/Project Coordinator: National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) Grant, *MST with Alcohol Abusing/Dependent Delinquents: Outcomes and Cost* (PI: Scott Henggeler; 3 million dollars; Sept 1999 - Aug 2004). The purpose of the study is to evaluate treatment effects on adolescent alcohol and drug use, criminal activity, and mental health functioning as well as on family relations, peer relations, and school attendance in the context of juvenile drug court. The study also track adolescent substance abuse and mental health service utilization, juvenile justice involvement, and out of home placements and their associated cost across treatment conditions for 18 months post recruitment. The study consists of two randomly assigned groups: MST combined with Community Reinforcement Approach (CRA, an empirically-based substance abuse treatment for adult addicts) and juvenile drug court versus juvenile drug court coupled with current substance abuse service provided in the community.

Co-Investigator/Project Coordinator: National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) Grant, *Randomized Clinical Trial of Juvenile Drug Court and MST* (PI: Scott Henggeler, 1.5 million dollars; Sept 1999 - Aug 2004). This study adds additional treatment conditions to the NIAAA, *MST with Alcohol Abusing/Dependent Delinquents: Outcomes and Cost*, study. The two additional conditions are MST(without CRA) coupled with drug court and current substance abuse services provided in the community without drug court. The adolescents in the latter group report to family court on an infrequent basis.

Co-Investigator/Project Coordinator: Center for Abuse Treatment Grant, *Evidenced-Based Treatment in Juvenile Drug Court* (PI: Scott Henggeler, 1.2 million dollars; Sept 2003 - Sept 2005). Building upon favorable outcomes achieved in *Randomized Clinical Trial of Juvenile Drug Court and MST* and *MST with Alcohol Abusing/Dependent Delinquents: Outcomes and Cost* studies, this study provide for the continuation of an MST/CRA team in drug court. The outcomes from this MST/CRA team will be compared with outcomes from the NIDA/NIAAA study.

Principle Investigator: University of Colorado Contract, *Multisystemic Therapy as a Residential Aftercare Model* (\$30,000; Feb 2003- Feb 2005). This study focuses on disseminating MST combined with Community Reinforcement Approach (CRA), a substance abuse treatment for adolescent that has had favorable results in two recent random clinical trials of MST and drug court (*Randomized Clinical Trial of Juvenile Drug Court and MST* and *MST with Alcohol Abusing/Dependent Delinquents: Outcomes and Cost*) to an university-based treatment program that provide intensive outpatient treatment for youth returning from residential placement. Duties include providing research guidance regarding assessment tools and implementation of MST combined with CRA.

Co-Investigator: MST Services Contract, *Evidenced Based Substance Abuse Treatment in New York* (PI: Phillippe Cunningham; \$180,000, Nov 2002 - Feb 2005). This research is designed to disseminate MST
