Spanish Language or Politics in Havana, Cuba

Dates: May 21 - June 12, 2004

Participants have the choice of focusing either on their Spanish language knowledge and skill or on the political process and diversity within Cuba. Both the Spanish and English programs incorporate a rich understanding of Cuban culture through immersion into society.

Fee: \$2,900 * Tuition is NOT included.**

Classical Studies in Greece

Dates: May 24 - June 21, 2004

Renaissance Studies in Rome and Florence, Italy

There will be a focus on the concept of humanism as it manifests itself in the literature, art and architecture of the Italian Renaissance, as well the study of the specific literary continuities between the English and Italian traditions.

Business and Religion in China

Dates: May 9- June 4, 2004

Fee: \$2,950, Tuition per course: \$564

Credits: Three semester hours

Courses: **BA 222 Principles of Economics.** This course intends to give the students a basic understanding of the free enterprise, capitalistic aggregate economic system. Dr. Dan Trotter, Assoc. Professor of Business Administration.

BA 299 Modern China Studies. This course begins with the premise that understanding how China has arrived at the last decade of the 20th century can also help us understand how other societies change, including such processes as democratization and marketization.

REL 299 The Major Religions of China. Four major religions have long histories in China: Taoism, Buddhism, Christianity and Islam. Lectures, readings, discussions and site visits will address the essential tenets of each of these religions as well as their respective histories in China. This travel course consists of didactic lectures, assigned readings and videos, and other discussions and activities, prior to travel, as well as at least eight days travel in Yucatan visiting relevant archaeological and modern Mayan sites. History, Spanish and Music on a European Tour

Dates: May 25 – June 28

Courses: HIS 299 The City as a Work of Art: Flanders and Spain (1 semester hour). HIS 299 is the "core course" which seeks to offer a common experience for members of the group providing a solid grounding in the major periods of European art and architecture, from the medieval to the modern. Dr. Kevin Kenyon, Assistant Professor of History

HIS 399 Moorish and Medieval Spain (2 semester hours). This course provides a survey of the Iberian Peninsula from the invasion of the Berbers in the 8th century to the ear of Ferdinand, Isabella and Columbus, giving emphasis to the Moorish achievement with its art, architecture and advanced learning. Dr. Kevin Kenyon, Assistant Professor of History.

MUS 230 Music Appreciation (3 semester hours). This course is aimed at developing musical listening and concert-going skills through the study of European art music from the 11th to the 20th centuries. Jazz and popular musical traditions may also be included. Dr. Graham Wood, Assistant Professor of Music.

MUS 299 European Music On Site (3 semester hours). Students who have already taken MUS 230 will be expected to display superior musical understanding in the assignments for this class. Since the musical content of the course is based almost entirely on the live concerts attended during this trip, there will be no duplication with any prior music class taken at Coker. SPA 102 Elementary Spanish II (3 semester hours). This course provides an introduction to the fundamentals of the Spanish language, emphasizing pronunciation, vocabulary, and elements of the grammar needed to read, write and speak Spanish at a basic level with accuracy and confidence.
